

A Letter from Pastor Tim

I never thought gathering each week for an entire year as a church would be such a blessing, but after two years of a mix of online and onsite gatherings, we finally had a "normal" year! And it amazes me how Jesus continues to work through imperfect people and imperfect leaders, to build His Church. In a time when the future of the church in America seems so unclear, I have never been more convinced that Jesus wants to do just that through us.

You may ask why I'm so convinced of that.

The answer? Because I see Him working through you.

I see the way you show up to worship together, the way you show up to serve each other and our community, and the way you show up to encourage each other in your groups. I was shocked to see how quickly our attendance numbers bounced back from pre-Covid with only two services. We've celebrated miraculous healing, salvations, healed marriages, restored relationships, broken addictions and so much more. That is why we do what we do and continue to ask: "how can we join Jesus in His rescue mission?"

As we look forward to the next twelve months of ministry, we have no idea what is going to happen with the economy, or Ukraine, or the mid-term elections, or Supreme Court cases, but we do know what we're supposed to be about—leading people into a growing relationship with Jesus by creating environments where life change can happen. That mission, that goal, that task is what I'm planning to spend my time and energy over the next twelve months accomplishing. Will you join me?

I count it an honor to serve alongside one of the greatest ministry teams and congregations this side of heaven!

What is one thing that surprised you in ministry?

I have been pleasantly surprised by the significant number of new folks attending worship services at Grace Point. We have an incredible opportunity and responsibility to invite those attendees to join us in biblical community because we believe that life change happens best in circles compared to rows.

How did you see God work in your ministry area this year?

The way God is working is best described by the words of people who are experiencing life change in groups. T.S. says, "Being part of a discipleship group has been amazing. I truly learned to rely on God to take away my worries. Confessing my sins or my short falls has left me more accountable to my faith. And learning that others have very relatable problems. My group is a true blessing especially to my faith relationship growing!"

If you could change one thing from the last year what would you do differently or change?

It's hard for me to imagine this as a possibility given that we have over 50 groups, but I would have liked to visit every Small Group and every D-Group at least once.

What was your highlight of the year?

I was overwhelmed with thankfulness at the response we received to the "Let's Talk" teaching series and small group curriculum. It was a lot of work to collaborate with other churches in putting this series together, but it was worth it! We had more people engaged in groups, forming new groups, and using the tools we created to invite people to church and into small groups!

What is one thing you're looking forward to next year?

I look forward to taking new ground through Groups ministry to connect more people into biblical communities. One project I'm particularly excited about is called Pioneer Basic Training through our partnership with Groundswell. Pioneers are missionary disciples called to find creative ways to engage and reach people who are unfamiliar with the established church. Pioneer Basic Training is a learning community for potential pioneers. It's a place to discover calling, develop ministry skills, and discern how to reach new frontiers with fresh expressions of the gospel.

Each time a child came back for the first time, they verbalized to us how much they missed being there and how much they missed their church! What a nice surprise it was to actually hear our kids missed us as much as we missed them! We still celebrate every time one of the kids comes back for the first time since Covid! Jesus really does make a difference in our relationship. We continue to learn that showing up consistently in the life of a child does make an incredible impact!

We raised \$17,743 at the Bake Auction to send students to camp! Thank you for your generosity. This was a record-breaking year and for the first time ever, a single item sold for more than \$1,000. That item alone sends about three kids to camp. And camp changes lives!

How did you see God work in your ministry area this year?

The conversations that the leaders and I have had with our students over the last year have been amazing. God is moving in big ways in our students' lives. Stereotypes say teens don't want to talk with adults, but our experience is that teens need a place where they can ask questions, give authentic opinions, and try to express who God is creating them to be. Tandem and our leaders are a place where they can find just that.

What is one thing you're looking forward to next year?

I am excited to bring on a new hire so that our students will have more people speaking truth and love into their lives.

What was your highlight of the year?

There have been two highlights for me this year. First, we added women to our usher team. Women have been serving in all other areas of Connections, so it was great to incorporate them in the sanctuary as well.

Second, we had an incredible response to the huge need for volunteers across three services for Easter. Connections Team needed nearly 50 people to meet the need, and more than that volunteered to serve - Praise the Lord!

If you could change one thing from last year, what would you do differently?

As I look back, I wish we could have restarted the home cookie delivery ministry, which had been paused during Covid. It is a popular and well received ministry to first-time visitors.
